

"A native Oregonian, Dee Hendrix is inspired by nature and has been creating art since childhood. While a Biology student at Willamette University, she was compelled to add a second major in Art. To further explore the intersection of biology and art, she temporarily left Oregon to continue her education at Rhode Island School of Design in the Technical and Scientific Illustration program. Over the years, she worked as a graphic designer, illustrator and art director; as well as in marketing and advertising communications. During this time, Dee's art had a commercial focus, far from the walls of a gallery.

Since retirement, she has dedicated more time to creating art inspired by nature. Subjects range from the hawks and eagles overhead, the bounty in her organic gardens, and the beautiful scenery of the Pacific Northwest.

Dee's art is a process of experimentation and interpretation. She enjoys the challenge of trying different techniques and approaches. 
**TOOLS NEEDED**: KAA will provide all tools and equipment for each class. Students are welcome to use their own supplies if available.
