Beautifying River Road Calling for Art Submissions for Shrink Wrapping Utility Boxes

There is a NEW project taking place in Keizer! This project is aimed at enhancing the visual appeal of River Road. As part of our ongoing efforts to promote local art and beautify the Keizer community, the City of Keizer is seeking art submissions for "shrink wrapping" utility boxes along River Road.

Imagine transforming these ordinary utility boxes into vibrant canvases that showcase the creativity and talent of our local artists. This project presents a unique opportunity to bring art to unexpected places, adding a touch of color and inspiration to the daily lives of residents and visitors alike.

Utility boxes are an integral part of our urban landscape, serving a practical purpose but often going unnoticed. By wrapping them in art, we can turn these typically dull structures into captivating pieces that engage and uplift the community. Shrink wrapping offers a durable and weather-resistant solution, ensuring that the artwork remains vibrant and intact for years to come.

How Can You Get Involved?

We invite all artists, both emerging and established, to submit their artwork for consideration. The theme for this project is open-ended, allowing for a wide range of artistic expressions. Whether your style is abstract, realistic, or something in between, we encourage you to share your vision with us.

Submission Guidelines:

- 1. Artwork must be submitted digitally, in a high-resolution format, with a minimum resolution of 300 dpi.
- 2. The dimensions of the artwork should be proportionate to the utility box size, with a suggested ratio of 1:1.5.

There is NO Submission Deadline.

Selections will be made by the Keizer Public Arts Commission.





"I have always had an interest in art, but only pursued becoming an artist after I retired.

My desire to paint with watercolors goes back to my early college days when I met a business executive who said he would take a dime-store set of watercolors on his business trips because he could always find water in a stream, fountain, or his waterglass. Watercolor painting seemed portable, it became a lifetime goal.

I have had the opportunity to travel, visiting about 30 countries. Seeing so much panoramic scenery, architecture, and museums, is immensely inspiring. I have also always had a keen interest in nature, hiking and camping. Painting has opened my eyes differently. I see so many more different colors, shapes, and shadows. Do you know how many shades of green there are?

I am fascinated with watching the paint flow on the paper with the water, as a pure color or as it mixes with other pigments. Watercolor can be a big mystery when you first start, but for me, the joy has been in letting the watercolor do its thing. I really enjoy trying new techniques and incorporating new things into my bag of options. I prefer objects and scenes, shapes and colors, something that evokes a memory or a feeling.

I am a member of Keizer Art Association, Wild Over Watercolor – WOW Guild of Artists, and the Watercolor Society of Oregon."





WATERCOLOR WORKSHOP: END OF WINTER BIRD

In this one-day workshop, we will practice a variety of watercolor techniques creating our own beautiful bird painting. We will be using bright, high pigment inks painting wet into wet, drybrush, layering and a variety of methods to create effects. Great for a beginner or an experienced painter who would like a paint session. All materials are included in the kit for a supply fee of \$15 paid directly to the instructor.

Pre-stretched #140 Arches watercolor paper with gummed brown tape on a backing board; assorted shapes & sizes painting brushes; Palette paper Paint: inks in the following colors – Phthalocyanine Blue, Azo Yellow, Quinacridone Magenta, Carbon Black, Burnt Sienna; copies of image source; carbon paper; tape; pencils; hairdryers; paper towels.
