

ARTIST OF THE MONTH Linda Chatfield




Linda, originally from New England, moved to Woodburn from Delaware in 2018 to be near her family.



CALL TO ARTISTS

The Keizer Art Association, in partnership with the Keizer Area Chamber of Commerce, invites you to participate in the first annual Riverwalk Art Fair.

This event coincides with the long-standing KeizerFest in the lovely Keizer Rapids Park. Artist vendor spaces will be along the shaded and paved walk by the Willamette River, which is a short walk from what will be the hustle and bustle of KeizerFest..

The fair is on August 9, 10 and 11, 2024, Set up is on August 8, 2024 – 3 to 7 pm. Hours on Friday and Saturday are from 10 am to 6 pm and Sunday hours are from 10 am to 3 pm. Load out on Sunday begins at 3 pm. Artist's booths must be occupied during the full hours stated above. There will be no early takedown.

This art fair will be open to all Oregon resident artists with their own original artwork and reproductions. Multiple artists may share space upon approval.

A 10 x 10 booth space will be available in the grass and along a paved pathway. Booths must have four-sided walls and must have straight weighted legs. Booth fees are \$150, any cancellations must be made by June 8^{th} (\$25 entry fee will be non-refundable). Four-sided tent rental available for \$225 additional.

There will be 24-hour security provided. NO commission on sales!




